Have still been operating as a society but not with us MW: with the proof of membership/interest they do have over 200 people on that social media account FC: It is quite an old group though so probably need more up to date evidence than this to make sure its relevant/people are still students MW: They haven't posted since 2021 on there so that makes sense JW: their constitution looks good NC: the group talks about doing pre-departure events- is this feasible? 	



- JW: I don't think anything about that is in their constitution- just in their proposal. A risk assessment could address issues around this though
- FC: it is a nice concept to support students on this though.
 Membership looks good and so do objectives
- MW: publicity officer- the phrasing around accountability sounds strange
- NC: I think it reads as taking responsibility as the main thing here
- GD: you could ask them for more information on an understanding of saying Vice President is accountable as one of your outcomes here
- JW: I think it is fine for a group to say they are working with the Guild
- FC: the group needs to give proof of interest from students and clarify understanding of responsibilities of vice president role



- GD: can we share Chair's Action meaning here please as part of training/understanding for new committee members?
- FC: Chair's Action means that a decision can be made by the Co-Chairs of the committee separately on email without the action needing to come back to an Activities Committee meeting to discuss. Within committee we can look to approve, reject or request more information

Mountaineering society emergency grant request • FC: group has around £8,000 in their account and are doing lots of trips. After all the trips have taken place they will have under £2,000 left. They will need to use this on subsidising and lots of other things too. The group wants to keep costs down due to the cost of living crisis. Cost is at least £100 extra per person already than last year MW: they have just specified **Grant Request** £100 less • FC: cost of trip does seem very high- I think we should give them something JW: do we know why they haven't got funding from UB **Sport**

- award there would be a reduction in ticket costs of around £65
- JW: is this really an unexpected/unforeseen cost?
- FC: should they have known that the costs were going to be as they are- emergency grant is 5% of the total grant pot, so isn't lots of money available. We have approximately £2,382 in that pot so their request would be about half of that pot. I think we should allocate them some
- NC: did we give them grant for this at the beginning of the year?
- JW: we did award the group a lot of money but it may not have been for this
- FC: can we check how much we gave them?
- MW: they would have been told how much money they were getting from UB Sport back in September time
- NC: they were given £2,400 from us at the start of the year which is a lot of money



- FC: there may be a lack of forward planning involved here but I also think it would be harsh to give them nothing at all
- GD: there is a question from Xinmin here in the chat too
- FC: Thanks Xinmin. Money is available to be allocated up until June 2023. We need to decide if we think this is an emergency or not to be able to award. What other options do we have- can they apply as part of the next round instead?
- SM: They can apply up until
 Friday and be included as part of the next round
- JW: I am sympathetic but this is only for 17 people
- FC: the group does have a lot of money in the bank
- XB: what is the definition of emergency and could they do this as a different kind of trip to help decrease costs?
- FC: it is up to the group how they budget- we could potentially



recommend ways they could look to make the trip cheaper?

- JW: are essentially asking for more money for an expensive trip
- GD: group asked for money towards a winter skills course for this trip but nothing else for Scotland
- FC: recommend that they apply as part of the round that is currently live

Committee unanimously agree to reject the emergency grant proposal, and request that the expense be considered as part of the upcoming round of grant decisions being made by the committee in week commencing 5th December.

• FC: purpose of looking at subgroups is to see how we can make decision making more efficient and responsive to group requests within Activities Committee. How many people do we think would need to look at operational matters such as group proposals/constitutional changes? I think we would need a full committee for audit, disciplinary matters and any **Activities** policy changes. What do people think about needing 1 officer and Committee 2 student roles present? sub-group discussion NC:I think this is a good idea and report backs to the committee would be useful to support with this- doing it in this way happens as part of other committees MW: would the entire committee have an opportunity to object if there was an issue? FC: we could agree to look at things on email afterwards. This could take a while to get everyone to come back on email though so may not be the most



- efficient way of approaching things
- MW: I am wary of moving to a place where less people are involved meaning less input and opportunity for others
- SM: the approach is about needing a minimum number of people to attend and we have some struggles with quoracy around this at the moment
- MW: giving people an opportunity to give feedback in advance could be a good work around with this
- FC: issue with sending email with comments is what do we do if there is a conflict of interest within that- think we would need to make sure that we have trust and faith in people who do attend the committee rather than getting feedback from all members as part of this

How many people do we think we need. I think 1 officer and 2 student committee roles



- JW: would say three people with
 1 being an officer and 1 being a
 student
- MW: would want more students than officers to be part of discussions if possible
- NC: we could look to change this again next year and re-evaluatecould revisit in preparation for the summer

Committee unanimously agree the following in relation to creating subgroups within Activities Committee:

- That sub-groups can exist to handle operational matters within Activities Committee with a minimum requirement of 1 Officer being present and 2 student committee members
- 2) That matters such as audit, disciplinary matters and policy changes cannot be covered within sub-groups, but will need to be brought to a full meeting

- GD: If you are not happy with answers given what would you like to do then
- FC: I think we would say no at that point as it would likely drag on/create some processing issues. If not clear enough at that point then it would be a no
- FC: with sub-groups this worked well last time and we had enough people at each meeting to make this happen
- GD: we can operate this as having 1 officer and 1 student at a minimum in each sub-group

Committee unanimously agree the following in relation to grant requests:

- That decisions can be made as part of sub-groups within committee meetings relating to grant
- That common principals must be agreed across all sub-groups to ensure fairness and consistency
