

## Who is responsible for the Elections?

Elections at the Guild of Students are administered by the Guild's Elections Team, and are overseen by your President. The Elections Team is part of the Student Voice & Representation Team and is a team of full-time core staff. The Returning Officer is responsible for the overall fair conduct of the elections.

## Are there any rules?

The Guild of Students' Election Regulations, Byelaws, and Zero Tolerance Policy, and all applicable University Regulations (e.g. Harassment & Bullying Policy) apply to this Election. ## Do I have to submit a written statement (manifesto) and candidate photo?

You must ideally submit a written statement (manifesto) and candidate photo.

In previous years, positions available in Autumn Elections have been highly contested, with as many as 20 candidates applying for 1 position – so having a photo, and written statement (manifesto) which clearly states why you want to apply, what your policies are and why you believe you are the best candidate for the role, will really help students to decide whether they should vote for you.

Students have also previously fed back that they are more likely to vote for candidates who have submitted a written statement and photo.

If you don't prefer to upload a photo of yourself, you can upload an avatar, drawing, meme, or something similar instead. ## Help! How do I campaign? I've never campaigned before!

### **Can I support my friend who is applying for another role?**

Of course! Candidates applying for different positions can help (endorse) each other.

### **What if I change my mind and no longer want to apply?**

You are free to withdraw at any time before, during or after the Election. If you want to withdraw, you should email [elections@guild.bham.ac.uk](mailto:elections@guild.bham.ac.uk). You don't need to provide a reason for withdrawing.

### **The website says I am not eligible to apply for a role, why is this?**

If you are a fully registered student, then you should be able to apply for a role that you want. Some roles require you to self-define. ### **Can I apply for more than one role?**

You can apply for more than one role, as long as they are not from the same committee. For example, you cannot apply to be a Sports Representative AND Student Groups Representative on the Activities Committee, but you could apply to be a Sports Representative on the Activities Committee and a School Rep.

You can also apply for a role on more than one committee. For example, you could apply to be a Sports Representative on the Activities Committee and Student Member (Open Place) on the Welfare & Liberation Committee. If you are elected for both positions though, you will only be able to do one position.
