Meeting / Project	Outcome for Students
Campus and Community Safety Group	Liaise with University and police stakeholders to improve student safety on campus and in Selly Oak and Bournbrook, and involve the Guild in local/national efforts to reduce violence against women and promote international student safety.
Good Campus Relations	Began attending in March as it was deemed relevant to my role. Particular themes have emerged around campus protests and more recently the encampment.
Period poverty	Free vend hoppers installed across campus including the Guild.

Selly Express	Reviewed provision of Selly Express and demand for Harborne route – 7pm trip now goes to Harborne. Accessible bus secured but going out to tender for the best deal.
Residences Master-planning Group	Uni is looking to develop new accommodation. I attend these meetings to advocate a student perspective and have consistently pointed out the Cost of Living, rent prices, etc.

Action Plan Aim #1	
Community Pantry and Free Breakfast program	
Context:	I had a manifesto commitment to expand the pantry offering, and after developing ideas with Community Welfare over the Summer, we agreed on a free breakfast program. The Cost-of-Living crisis has meant that many students have had to skip meals to save on costs. Many students do not eat breakfast for a multitude of other reasons such as simply not having time.
Progress:	100% - Community Breakfast continued this semester. Graduation, Funding & Awards Team, Pause, and Community Safety Team have attended and breakfasts have been hosted in MDS. Senior student staff hired to coordinate management without me present - has been embedded as a regular thing Guild will do from now on.

Action Plan Aim #2	
Renter’s Union/Housing Hub	
Context:	Manifesto commitment to review the Renters’ Union as an umbrella brand to streamline and de-silo Guild housing work. Students will be supported in their off-campus lives and provided with relevant and up-to-date information. Having all of the information in one place will empower students to make independent and informed decisions and raise issues with their landlords with the benefit of further support if necessary.

Progress:	90% - Housing working group established and comms plan established to bring all Guild activity under one heading as 'Housing Hub.' The first two sections of the Hub are live: 'Starting Your Search' and 'Preparing to Rent.' The third section is ready and will go live when students move in/out. Current work also beginning around promoting Marks out of Tenancy.
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Action Plan Aim #3

Cultural Calendar

Context:	Working with Comms & Marketing to produce an updated plan for communications will ensure that no student feels unrepresented/unseen by the Guild. Liaising with cultural and religious societies to do this allows students themselves to have greater agency over which celebrations and events get promoted and how.
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Progress:	100% - Calendar finished, C&M developing resources and reaching out to relevant groups, calendar to be reused next year.
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Action Plan Aim #4

Harm Reduction Drug & Alcohol Policy

Context:	This was not something originally on my manifesto explicitly but something I have since picked up under the heading of increasing well-being support for students. A UUK report that recommends a Harm Reduction approach is to be released imminently. It is therefore essential for the University and the Guild to work in partnership to implement these strategies.
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Progress:	40% - Paper approved by Guild Trustee Board and Steering Group established to lobby UEB. We have secured Neil Hanley as a sponsor for the paper and are seeking advice from other Unis/SUs on how to implement this.
